Napa, CA – The Winegrowers of Napa County have endorsed Ryan Gregory for the 2nd District seat on the Napa County Board of Supervisors.

Ryan Gregory finished with 41.5% of the vote in the four-person June primary. The 2nd Supervisorial District encompasses much of western Napa, including parts of Browns Valley and downtown Napa, as well as unincorporated areas west of Napa stretching to the Sonoma-Napa County line.
